PARKING

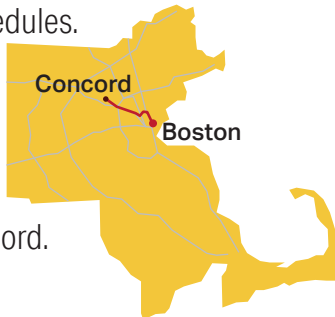
Overnight parking available by request, April-October
